What's in the Boats?

- In 2007, we moved 32.8 million metric tons in and out of the Port of New York and New Jersey
 - The value of that cargo was \$166.1 Billion
 - 3.1 million containers and 930,298 vehicles
 - Largest imports – beverages, vehicles, plastics, furniture, paper and paperboard
 - Largest exports – woodpulp, plastics, vehicles, auto parts

Where's it from? Where's it Going?

- Top ranking trade partners (import and export) China, Italy, India, Germany, Brazil, Japan, Netherlands, UK, France and Spain
 - 1,831,800 import containers stay within 260 miles of the Port of New York and New Jersey – bringing the most affluent consumer market in the world the goods that they use in their day-to-day lives.
